**Persuasive Writing Sample**

Valentine's Day is nothing more than a hyped-up, over-commercialized, Hallmark holiday. While it is most certainly a moneymaker for restaurants, jewelers, florists, candy shops, and the like, it is not always the happiest day of the year for everyone else, even those lucky few in a committed, loving relationship. **Informative Writing Sample**

Valentine's Day is celebrated every year on February 14<sup>th</sup>. Symbols associated with St. Valentine's Day include hearts, doves, and the winged Cupid. In Roman mythology (Paganism), Cupid is the god of love, passion, and desire. He is often portrayed with a bow and arrow. It is believed that those who are shot with Cupid's arrow are immediately filled with uncontrollable love and desire.

Today, Valentine's Day is celebrated in the United States, Canada, Mexico, Great Britain, and Australia. Friends and lovers exchange greeting cards, flowers, chocolates, and other sweet treats to celebrate friendship and romance. According to the U.S. Greeting Card Association, 190 million valentine cards and 15 million e-valentines are sent each year in the U.S. St. Valentine's Day, as it is now celebrated, has roots in history, Pagan and Christian beliefs, and cultural traditions.

**Entertaining Writing Sample**

Alex sat on the bus to school, staring blankly out the window. Houses and trees whooshed by in a blur, but he didn't notice. His mind was somewhere else. He unconsciously fidgeted with the red card on his lap, and his left foot tapped the floor nervously. Tha-thump, squeaaaaaak, hissssssssss. The bus had stopped, right in front of the school. Pushing, shoving, and laughing, the other students rushed to the front of the bus to get off. But not Alex. There he sat, his heart pounding so hard that he was sure everyone could hear it, even over the cheerful morning bus routine. Finally, when Alex was the only one left on the quiet, empty bus, he stood up. He carefully tucked Sophie's red card in his coat pocket, took a big gulp, and said to himself, "Well, here goes nothing!"

**Answer Key/Discussion:**

The first piece is entertaining, but it is also persuasive. The author is attempting to convince you that Valentine's Day is not the only day, or even the ideal day, to show a partner love and affection. The second piece is informative because the author includes several facts (symbolism, history, etc.) without being emotional or persuasive in any way. The third piece is entertaining due to the inclusion of description ("houses and trees whooshed by in a blur," etc.). In addition, the author is attempting to keep the reader's attention through suspense.
